

JOINT FUNDING AGREEMENT
TREASURE VALLEY STORMWATER PUBLIC EDUCATION PROGRAM

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the City of Boise, hereinafter “Boise,” the City of Caldwell, hereinafter “Caldwell”, and Partners for Clean Water, hereinafter, with a combined reference hereinafter “funding partners,” for the purpose of jointly funding the Treasure Valley Stormwater Public Education Program.

WHEREAS, Boise, and Caldwell (collectively “the Cities”) are subject to Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) NPDES permits issued by the U.S. EPA which regulate discharges to Waters of the US including the Boise River and its tributaries; and:

WHEREAS, the Cities have public education requirements in each of their MS4 permits; and

WHEREAS, the Treasure Valley is one media market; and

WHEREAS, the Partners for Clean Water has established a robust stormwater public education program; and

WHEREAS, all MS4 permittees in the valley have a common interest in delivery of appropriate and cost effective control of stormwater, including development and delivery of an effective stormwater public education program; and

WHEREAS, Boise has primary responsibility for implementation of the Partners for Clean Water public education program for stormwater in the Boise MS4 permit; and

WHEREAS, National Academies 2008 Stormwater Program Review includes recommendations for EPA to revise the stormwater program to work on watershed scale; and

WHEREAS, EPA has drafted and will propose a new stormwater rule based on the National Academies Stormwater Program Review later this fall; and

WHEREAS, the funding partners have determined funding contribution amounts for fiscal year 2018 for use of Partners for Clean Water stormwater public education materials and outreach; and

WHEREAS, the funding partners desire to enter into this agreement to formalize the funding partners funding and other obligations to comply with MS4 permit requirements

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises, it is agreed:

1. The Partners for Clean Water will provide stormwater public education content and media buys for all lower Boise River MS4 permittees participating in the Treasure Valley Stormwater Public Education Program for fiscal year 2018.

2. The funding partners agree to the following cost sharing amounts for the joint funding of the Partners for Clean Water stormwater public education materials and media buys for fiscal year 2018:

- Boise (Partners for Clean Water) - \$15,000
- Caldwell - \$15,000


3. Boise shall invoice each of the funding partners for their funding share quarterly. The funding partners shall pay their invoiced share to Boise within 30 days of invoice receipt.


4. The term of this agreement from October 1, 2017 through September 30, 2018.
